Our Story and Impact on Our Community

Established in 1995 under the City of Dunn Police Department and operated out of the backseat of a police car by our current Executive Director Rodney Rowland, Dunn PAL was first started as a community policing tool to help lower the juvenile crime in the Dunn area by working with police officers, community members and youth in various programs and events to keep youth off the streets and out of trouble.

In 2013 the Dunn Police Athletic & Activities League, Inc. was incorporated as a non-profit organization dedicated to giving back to the community by spearheading afterschool programs for children. The activities we organize include, an academic enrichment program during after school hours, mentoring program, Youth Leadership Council, Police Explorer Post, and summer camp programs, as well as but are not limited to various sports like basketball, wrestling, flag football.

The Dunn PAL has been serving the Dunn area for 29 years. Since our founding we have impacted the lives of nearly 6,000 children. Most of the children we serve come from single parent homes living below the poverty line. Each day after school from 3-6pm we provide them academic support and enrichment activities designed for personal growth. Our goal is to encourage our kids to grow up to be well-disciplined, educated, successful productive citizens who will one day serve others.



Opioid Prevention and Substance Misuse Program



Dr. Christopher Hall joined us this year as the Opioid Prevention Specialist. Dr. Hall has a Doctorate in Theology and Sociology which allows him to easily connect positively and influence our youth to make the best choices for their lives and the lives of those around them.

Our goal for this program is to design, implement, and evaluate initiatives aimed at preventing opioid misuse and substance abuse among the youth of Dunn and the surrounding areas.

Dr. Hall's main focus will be advocating for policy and legislation that support prevention efforts and increase access to treatment and recovery for effected youth. His outstanding personality and willingness to put in hard work has already brought hope and joy to those he has interacted with.



Mentoring

Boris Ashford joined us this year as the Mentor Coordinator. His role is to implement youth mentoring programs that strengthen and expand mentoring services to the at-risk/high-risk youth population. The goal of this program is to match the youth of Dunn with a mentor who can help them grow on a personal and academic level.



Boris has successfully cultivated relationships with the local schools, community organizations, volunteers, and over 30 mentees since joining such a short time ago.

Following NPAL Grant guidelines and operating within Dunn PAL's mission and objectives Boris has cultivated additional supplemental educational materials, seminars, workshops and mentorship activities helps keep Dunn's youth engaged and uplifted.

As the Mentor Youth Coordinator, Boris has pledged to advocate for policy and legislation that supports prevention efforts and increase access to needed services in the community.








Program Revenue: The largest portion being 42% comes from generous local donors showcasing strong community support, trust, and engagement.
