Feedback: Participate in periodic reviews/surveys and provide constructive feedback to help improve the program's effectiveness.

Preparedness: Be prepared for each session by reviewing any materials or instructions provided in advance. Each class has an Instructor who can provide you with this information.

Engagement: Actively engage with students and staff, fostering a positive and productive environment.
